## Questions That Promote Deeper Thinking

Questions That Promote Deeper Thinking Surveys of college faculty reveal that their number one instructional goal is to promote critical thinking, and reports on the status of American higher education have consistently called for greater emphasis on the development of college students' critical thinking skills

## Questions to provoke thinking and discussion

These questions get students thinking about properties of different forces and their effect on the world They also encourage students to consider whether forces explain or merely describe situations and how we can know that forces exist To access these questions, students will need to know about different forces and what they do
